



## **HIGH SCHOOL HONOR ROLL**

The Regional School Unit-24 (RSU) Board (RSUB) believes that achieving Honor Roll status in RSU high schools is a distinction all students should strive to attain. The RSUB therefore sets the following requirements that students must meet or exceed for each Honor levels.

### **The policy of the RSUB is that:**

- A. Grades are computed numerically but the relationship between numerical and letter grades are as follows:

99-100 = A+	83-84 = C+
95-98 = A	79-82 = C
93-94 = A-	77-78 = C-
91-92 = B+	75-76 = D+
87-90 = B	72-74 = D
85-86 = B-	70-71 = D-

69 and below, fail = F

- B. To qualify for honor roll status, a student must:
1. Be enrolled in and receive grades for five (5) or more full credit courses, or equivalent,
  2. Earn passing grades in all courses for the ranking period considered,
- C. The three (3) levels of Honors in RSU high schools are:
1. Highest Honors: Average > 95, no grade below 90;
  2. High Honors: Average 90 to 100, no grade below 85;
  3. Honors: Average 85 to 100 only 2 grades between 80 and 84.
- D. Requests to change a student grade:
1. Appeals of grades may only be made for reasons allowed by law and must be made within thirty (30) days of the date the grade was issued. Maine law provides that when grades are given for any course of instruction offered by a school, the grade awarded to a student is the grade determined by the teacher of the course and the determination of a student's grade by that teacher, in the absence of clerical or mechanical mistake, fraud, bad faith or incompetence, is final.
- E. A student having an "incomplete" at the time the Honor Roll is published will not be included in the published listing.
1. A student with grades in the appeals process at the time the Honor Roll is published will not be included in the published listing.
